BIGGLESWADE UNITED

Biggleswade United Football Club was re-formed on the 16th July 1959. However, local history records indicate that there was a Biggleswade United side playing at Second Meadow as early as 1929. Our first season (1959/60) saw us competing in Division Three of the North Herts. League (NHL). After 10 successful years in the NHL the club made the step up to South Midlands League (SML) football. But towards the end of a 15-year association with the SML the club began to struggle and after three years of finishing in the bottom three of Division One we sought fresh fields. The club joined the Herts. Senior but club continued to find the going tough. In 1986 we elected to return to local League football, joining the Bedford and District Football League and began to build again.

The appointment of Brian Swords as first team manager in 87/88 proved to be the turning point in the club's fortunes. During the next ten years the club achieved a tremendous amount of success on and off the football pitch. Our record of League and Cup honours speak for themselves but aligned to this a great deal of work went on behind the scenes to match the on-field success. The club now boasts one of the best clubhouse and ground facilities in the Mid-Bedfordshire area. The success of the club has also attracted many new players as well as commanding a great deal of loyalty from those players who helped the club progress from Division Three of the Bedford and District League to County Senior Club status in just 15 years.

The 1995/96 season was the most successful in the club's history - winning five major honours; the Beds Intermediate County Cup, Bedford and District League Championship, League Cup Championship and as the League's representatives the club won the Beds. FA Centenary Cup. Having won every major Bedford League honour the club felt it was time to move on and made the decision to make the step up once again and returned to Division One of the SML. In an exceptionally successful first season we celebrated a Division One "double" by winning the Championship and the Division One Cup. We also retained the Beds. FA Intermediate County Cup, only the second club in the competition's history to achieve this feat. To crown our success the club were awarded the SML Special Achievement Trophy in July 1997.

In the season 1997/98 we finally achieved Senior status. This was achieved not only through the endeavours of the players on the field but ultimately as a result of an extremely hard working committee. With the help of the Biggleswade Town Council a new stand was erected and perimeter fencing installed. And two seasons later the club erected floodlights and on the evening of 26th October 1999 we played our first-ever floodlit game at Second Meadow, Ryman League side Leighton Town were the visitors in the Bedfordshire Premier Cup.

The next eleven years saw the first team led by Steve "Snowy" Wright and under his management the club continued to enjoy a very high level of League and Cup success ultimately achieving promotion to the Molten Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division and with it the opportunity to compete in the FA Cup. And under Snowy the club made three Beds FA Senior Challenge Cup final appearances, winning two of the three with victories over Stotfold (4-1) and Leighton Town (1-0) but missed out in 2006/07 going down 2-0 to Dunstable Town. Snowy's other cup successes came in the form of the Hunts Premier Cup, North Beds Charity Cup, Hinchingsbrooke Cup, the SML Division One Cup and the SML Special Achievement Award once again. The end of the 2006 2007 saw Snowy step down as manager with his assistant, Nick Burton taking over the first team reins. January 5th 2009 saw the club embark on further ambitious ground improvements. With financial backing from Biggleswade Town Council, Mid Beds District Council and the Football Foundation we installed a 260-seater stand, fully enclosed the ground with a double turnstile entrance and players' secure walkway which raised the ground to Grade E status.

After several years of stability in terms of first team managers the next six years saw a regular turnover of first team and reserve team managers with Nick Burton, Dave Elkin and Phil Childs all taking over the first team reins for a time.

At the start of the 2013 2014 season we appointed Mick Reardon and Mark Royal as first team managers both of whom had enjoyed success as coaches at the higher levels of football. Their disciplined approach was quickly adhered to and responded to by the players and under their stewardship we achieved the highest Premier Division position in nine years and first silverware in seven years winning the North Beds Charity Cup for the first time in the club's history.

In November 2014 the club took a further positive step to realise our ambitions with the appointment of Sky Sports Presenter and renowned author, Guillem Balague as Biggleswade United's Director of Football. Following Mick and Mark's decision to step down at the end 2014 2015, Guillem was quick to act and recruited a new Head Coach in Cristian Colas Beccera. Cristian was assisted by former professional player, Stuart Bimson, and under their guidance the team finished in eighth spot in the Premier Division in 2017 2018 - the highest position in the club's history. Having built a strong reputation for their outstanding coaching ability and playing philosophy Cristian and Stuart moved up to Step 3 level club, Staines Town, for the start of the 2018 2019 season. Guillem was again in search for a high quality coach and Jimmy Martin came highly recommended by his predecessor, Colas, who worked with Jimmy at Stevenage FC Academy. Jimmy was appointed Manager in May 2018 but he tendered his resignation in October 2018 having been offered a "hard to refuse" opportunity to take up a coaching role at Premier Division club Watford. Despite the setback the first team went on to record their highest ever League placing - a fourth spot in the Premier Division.

In the season 2019 2020 the club were sitting in a highly commendable third position in the Premier Division and under the management of Chris Devane and Trishnan Patel were hoping for a promotion play off opportunity. However, in March 2020 the season was decalred Null and Void by the FA after the devastating outbreak of the Coronavirus. The club were also to learn that Chris and Tishnan had accepted the offer to work at Step 4 and departed the club at short notice. Fortunately the club were able to call upon the services of former Head Coach Cristian Colas and former assistant manager Mark Royal who will take over the first team reins for season 2020 2021 - whatever that may look like.

The club has certainly come a long way in relatively few years but we could not have done it without the help of a very supportive Town and District Council who clearly understand the benefits of having a community based club in Biggleswade. Our success is also very much down to a very hard working committee who throughout the year - not just the football season - continue to volunteer their time and commitment to the club, to help it continue to thrive and be a source of enjoyment for our supporters and the Biggleswade community.

Crawley Green 4 Leverstock Green 2
Tuesday 13th October 2020

Ill-discipline and defensive errors contributed to Leverstock Green suffering a 4-2 defeat at Crawley Green in a game played behind closed doors at The Brache on Tuesday night. Despite playing with ten men for two-thirds of the game and with nine men for a ten-minute period, they were never out of the game until the very end.

There was a debut for Thomas Littleboy, who signed a couple of weeks ago but had been unable to play until now due to a five-game suspension picked up at his previous side Amersham Town.

The home side took the lead in the 8th minute through one of the first mistakes of the game, as Kian Wilkes gave the ball away outside his own box, and Phil Draycott hit an angled drive into the bottom corner of the net. However, Wilkes made up for his error in the 15th minute as he received a pass from Steve Hawes and hit a tremendous shot from distance which also found the bottom corner of the net to level the scores at 1-1.

Matt Fallon denied Draycott a second goal in the 21st minute as he dived to his right to turn away a free kick. Leverstock's task was made harder in the 36th minute when they were reduced to ten men. The referee adjudged that Littleboy had deliberately stamped on an opponent and showed a straight red card to bring his debut to an early end.

Four minutes before half time the Leverstock ranks were reduced even further. Fallon appeared to be fouled by an opponent and when Brima Johnson protested to the referee he was sin-binned for dissent.

The nine men made it to half time with the scores still level, and through the opening six minutes of the second half, during which Fallon made an excellent close-range save from Jonathan Barnett. However, within seconds of Johnson rejoining the game Danny Watson shot home a second goal for Crawley Green to put them back into the lead.

There was a chance of an equaliser on 61 minutes when Oran Swales crossed into the box for Frank Jowle, but Jowle couldn't get enough on his shot to trouble the keeper. Two minutes later a foul by Jamie Ovington on Sam Holmes gave the home side a penalty, which Watson tucked away to put Crawley Green into a 3-1 lead.

Leverstock still weren't out of the game. In the 67th minute a determined run from Luke Peerless was brought to an end by a foul just outside the box. The result was a free kick in a similar position to that which Peerless scored from on Saturday, and once again he found the net, this time without a deflection as he lifted the ball over the wall into the top corner to pull the score back to 3-2.

A double substitution on 74 minutes saw Leverstock switch to 3-5-1, and for the remainder of the game it was end-to-end. Fallon produced another great save to deny Mark Bunker on 82 minutes, while three minutes later a curling shot from Swales was saved. However, two minutes into stoppage time another error at the back saw Fallon throw the ball out to Swales with an opponent in close proximity who won the ball and crossed to the far post where Draycott headed home the goal that sealed the win for Crawley Green

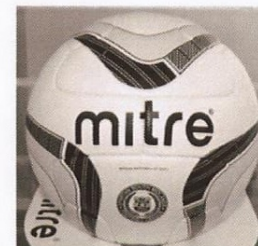

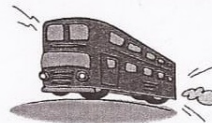

Leverstock Green's inconsistent form continued as they suffered a second straight defeat after last Saturday's impressive win over Newport Pagnell. As with Tuesday night's defeat at Crawley Green, there was also a red card in this game, but this time it was opponents Harefield United who were down to ten men for two-thirds of the game. Despite their numerical disadvantage, Harefield worked hard to keep the Green at bay, in a game that also saw two missed penalties.

For the first time in a home game this season Leverstock were attacking up the slope in the first half. The game's first effort on goal came in the 11th minute, and it was a stunner from Harefield's Harry McCorkell, who struck a shot from distance that Matt Fallon got a hand to, but could not prevent from flying into the net.

However, in the 29th minute Harefield were reduced to ten men, as Lindell Stewart was shown a straight red card for striking out at a Green player right in front of the referee.

Leverstock's first real chance came on 37 minutes as a pass from Luke Peerless put Giuseppe Delgaudio through on goal, but his shot went across goal and wide. Four minutes later a cross from Dan Weeks found Jamie Ovington in the box, but again the resulting shot went wide. The flurry of chances continued as Lenny Farhall shot just over the bar for Harefield on 42 minutes, and a fierce strike from John Smith went just over the bar two minutes later.

In the last minute of the half Farhall looked set to score a second for Harefield as he was clean through, but Fallon got a hand on his shot to tip it into the air, and Mickey Shuttlewood completed the save by sliding in to clear the ball off the line. However, the ball went back to Farhall, who was then brought down by Ovington to present Harefield with a penalty. An extraordinary period of play was completed by Farhall's penalty being saved by Fallon.

It was only a brief reprieve though, as two minutes into stoppage time Farhall was clean through again with the Leverstock defence looking for an offside flag that did not come, and Farhall unselfishly squared to Samuel Adetiba, who had little more than a tap-in to score a crucial second goal for Harefield on the stroke of half time.

Leverstock made a strong start to the second half. On 51 minutes Cass Grant was brought down just outside the box for a free kick in a similar position from which Peerless had scored in the previous two games. Peerless took the kick again, lifting it over the wall, but it went agonisingly wide and hit the stanchion behind the goal. A minute later Grant was in with a good chance but keeper Reece Mallett came off his line and charged down Grant's shot.

On 55 minutes Leverstock could have been further behind when they were caught on the break. Farhall was clean through and sent a lob over Fallon, but it hit the base of the post and went wide.

On 69 minutes Tom Littleboy took a corner which looked to be heading straight in until Mallett tipped it over. From the subsequent corner both Shuttlewood and Delgaudio got their heads on the ball but couldn't divert it on target. Littleboy then pulled the ball back for Steve Hawes, who shot over the bar. Soon after Leverstock had another great chance when Littleboy was brought down in the box and the referee pointed to the spot. Peerless stepped up to take the penalty and sent it to Mallett's left, but it hit the outside of the post and went wide.

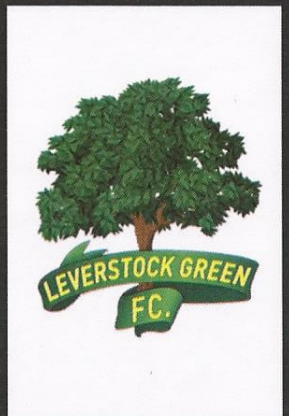
That proved to be the last chance for Leverstock to get back into the game. In fairness they were missing a few important players, and there wasn't a lot to choose between the teams over the course of the game, but Harefield looked organised and efficient and deserved their win

Safety briefing before each fixture

- **After the game.** Be aware that other users may be waiting to use the facilities. Changing rooms and showers are likely to be closed and any socialising must follow the **Government's guidance** on social distancing.

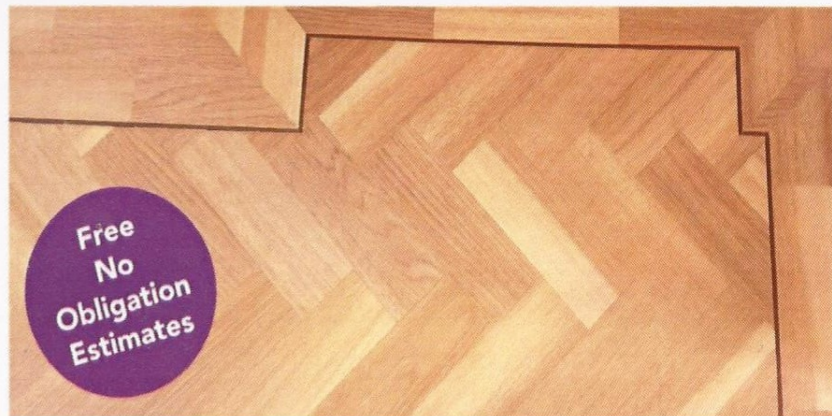

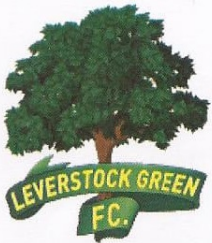
