Good afternoon to you all, today we welcome the Players,

Officials and Supporters of Newport Pagnell Town Football Club.. We also welcome today's Officials the Referee Sobastian Frazer and his assistants Oliver Simnock and Steven Williams. The first team had their first league win at home by a goal to nil against North Greenford United followed by a trip to Baldock Town where they came away with three points in a three one win. On Tuesday they were on their travels again and up against current league leaders Colney Heath where we were a goal in front at half time with this lead kept intact with a penalty save by Matt Fallon but went down to two late Colney goals. On Thursday the Under 18 team went into their third game in this seasons FA Youth Cup when they entertained Wealdstone. The game finished level at two goals each and with no extra-time in this years competition went straight to kicks from the penalty spot where we went out by eight to seven penalties. On Tuesday evening the first team go to Crawley Green with this game behind closed doors.

WELCOME TO PANCAKE LANE NEWPORT PAGNELL TOWN

Newport Pagnell Town Football Club was founded in 1963 as Newport Pagnell Wanderers, playing on Bury Field Common.

In 1964 they entered the North Bucks League and won Division 3 in their first season. Soon after that they won the Division 2 and Division 1 titles in consecutive years.

In the 1971-72 season they joined the South Midlands League, playing at the Youth Club.

In 1972 the club moved to the new facilities at the Willen Road Sports Ground and changed its name to Newport Pagnell Town.

In the 1973-74 season Newport Pagnell Town joined Division 2 of the United Counties League. Two years later they were promoted to Division 1. They won the Division 1 Championship in 1981-82 and were promoted to the Premier Division.

After relegation in 1985-86, promotion back to the Premier Division in 1991-92 and then relegation again in 1996-97, the club won the Division 1 Championship in 2001-02 and remained in the Premier Division after that. In 2009-10 and in 2010-11 the club won the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy. The best FA Cup achievement was reaching the Second Qualifying Round in 2008-09.

In 2016-17 the club reached the last 8 of the FA Vase before losing to a strong South Shields team (the eventual winners of the competition) in front of more than 3000 spectators on Tyneside. In recognition of this the club was presented with a Town Award by Newport Pagnell Town Council and received the Team of the Year award in the Milton Keynes Sports Achiever of the Year 2017 awards.

A further award in 2017 was a Berks & Bucks FA award to the club chairman, Steve Handley, for his contribution to grassroots football.

In 2017-18 the club finished third in the UCL Premier Division, missing out on promotion by just three points. A good season for the youth section included winning the Berks & Bucks Under 15 county cup.

For 2019-20 the FA moved the club into the Premier Division of the Spartan South Midlands League. Before the season was declared null and void because of the Covid-19 pandemic, three wins over teams from higher leagues in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup had earned a semi-final against Wycombe Wanderers, which was unfortunately never played because the competition was abandoned.

From small beginnings, Newport Pagnell Town has become the highest placed non-league club in the Milton Keynes area, and is a FA Charter Standard Community Club, with a youth section of around 30 teams in addition to its senior teams.

Leverstock Green got their first league points on the board with a hard-fought win against a competitive North Greenford United side on Tuesday night.

The goal which proved to be the winner came very early in the match. In the 3rd minute, Will Bisney – making his competitive debut for the club – crossed from the left side of the penalty area, and Luke Peerless came in at the far post to sweep the ball home.

The visitors had a clear target man in their side, with big veteran centre forward Melford Simpson up front, and in the 6th minute Simpson rose at the far post to meet a cross but his header was just wide. Simpson was close again in the 19th minute with a shot wide, but for the most part the Leverstock defence did a very good job in keeping him quiet.

Leverstock had a chance for a second goal on 28 minutes when a pass from Steve Hawes gave Sidney Gueye a run at goal, but keeper Sam House saved with his legs, and Frank Jowle's effort from the rebound went over the bar. The visitors went close again five minutes before the break when a chip from Conor Molyneaux landed on the crossbar, and in the closing minutes of the half both James Hall and Adiel Mannion got on the end of free kicks from Peerless, but neither could get their headers on target.

The second half proved equally evenly-contested, with Leverstock being somewhat fortunate to survive an almighty goalmouth scramble following an NGU corner in the 56th minute. Leverstock went close again on 60 minutes when Frank Jowle's corner was flicked on by Gueye and Hall came in with a diving header, but House somehow kept the ball out.

A second goal looked certain four minutes from time when Peerless hit a shot that was heading for the top corner, but Kojo Agyemang made a great clearance to head it off the line. Still there might have been a second goal two minutes later when Jowle was put through on goal, but shot over the bar.

The game was still in the balance going into stoppage time, but Leverstock held out for a very welcome three points, well-deserved for a very determined performance all round but particularly in the defence and midfield

Having won Saturday's game at Baldock on the strength of their second half performance, this time Leverstock Green found themselves on the wrong end of a second half recovery as Colney Heath came from behind to win this SSML Premier Division game with two late goals.

Leverstock survived a couple of early scares, with the ball having to be headed off the line in the aftermath of a corner in the 5th minute, but in general the game was rather scrappy for the first half hour. They took the lead with a well-worked goal in the 38th minute. James Hall played a superb lengthy crossfield ball to find Brima Johnson near the corner flag, and Johnson's cross was bundled into the net from close range by Guiseppe Delgaudio, scoring for the second successive game.

In the second half Leverstock were playing up the slope, and came under pressure from the home side for long periods. Colney Heath had a great chance to equalise in the 52nd minute when George Devine was brought down in the box by Jamie Ovington and the referee awarded a penalty, but Devine's spot kick was not the best and Matt Fallon dived to his right to save it.

There were two new signings on the bench for Leverstock this evening, and one of them, Toby Shoyoye, came on in the 68th minute to replace Delgaudio, who had just been somewhat fortunate to only receive a yellow card for a poor tackle.

Colney Heath continued to put pressure on the Leverstock goal, winning a succession of corners and free kicks around the box, and eventually they made one of their corners pay in the 79th minute. The ball was cleared to the edge of the penalty area where substitute Hadley Gleeson connected with a first time shot that found the bottom corner of the net to level the scores at 1-1.

Leverstock had little sight of goal during the second half, but in the 84th minute they had a great chance to go back in front. Will Bisney's pass put Shoyoye through on goal, but former Green keeper Matt Evans came quickly off his line to save Shoyoye's shot and deny him a goal on his debut.

That proved crucial, as the home side won another corner two minutes later, and this time Bailey Stevenson pounced on a loose ball to volley home the goal that put his side in front at 2-1.

Leverstock pushed forward during stoppage time and had a couple of dangerous situations inside the Colney box, but they were unable to find the goal to save the game, and Colney Heath took the three points which were deserved on their second half performance.

FA Youth Cup 2nd Qualifying Round Leverstock Green 2 (7) Wealdstone 2 (8) Thursday 8th October 2020

There was heartbreak for Leverstock Green's under-18s as they exited the FA Youth Cup on penalties, having only been denied the win by a Wealdstone equaliser in stoppage time, and despite scoring seven penalties in the shootout.

Wealdstone dominated the early stages of the game, attacking down the slope, although the Green side looked promising on the break. They had the ball in the net in the 30th minute, but Nana Yeboah's goal was chalked off by the offside flag. Two minutes later Wealdstone were gifted a goal as Leverstock keeper Lawrence Knowles misjudged the bounce of the ball inside his own penalty area, and was helpless as the ball went over his head to leave the visitors with a tap-in to take the lead.

The second half saw a much better display from the Leverstock side, and they deservedly levelled the scores in the 58th minute. Alfie Bigg's long throw into the box was not cleared, and David Emiloju pounced on the loose ball to shoot home the equaliser.

Midway through the half Knowles, who appeared to be suffering a lack of confidence after his earlier error, was replaced by sub keeper Joe Pinnock. Eight minutes from time Leverstock put themselves within touching distance of a place in the next round. Yeboah's run into the box was ended by a foul challenge, and Lewis Nicholls netted the resulting penalty to put the Green side 2-1 up.

There was almost a third goal straight afterwards when Yeboah got on the end of a cross from Bigg but couldn't keep the ball under the bar from close range. As the game went into stoppage time Leverstock were still leading, but as a result of not taking care of the ball as much as they should have, they conceded a free kick in a dangerous position just outside their own box. Wealdstone took full advantage of the opportunity as Tecane Shrowder blasted the free kick straight into the bottom corner of the net to level scores at 2-2 in the second minute of stoppage time.

The tie then went into a penalty shoot-out, and it started well for Leverstock as Pinnock saved Wealdstone's first kick from Rauri O'Connor. The next six penalties were all scored, with Nana Yeboah, Alfie Atkins and Ben Payne scoring for Leverstock. However, David Emiloju put Leverstock's fourth penalty over the bar to leave the score at 3-3 after four penalties each. The next eight penalties were scored, with Alfie Bigg, Ethan Bradbury, Jaylan Hector and Dylan Jones all scoring for Leverstock to make it 7-7 after eight kicks each. Wealdstone then scored again and thought they had won when their keeper saved Leverstock's ninth penalty from Aidan O'Connor. However, the referee ordered a retake as the keeper moved too soon. O'Connor wasn't able to take advantage of his reprieve, though, as his second attempt hit the bar on its way over, leaving Wealdstone the winners by 8-7 on penalties.

A superb second half display saw Leverstock Green register their second league win in a row and their first away win of the season in Saturday's visit to Baldock Town.

The Green side made a tentative start to the game, and found themselves a goal down in the 10th minute. Aedan Gaffney was allowed far too much time and space to turn and run at the Green defence before threading a pass to Scott Piggott, who slotted from a narrow angle past Matt Fallon.

Leverstock finally started getting into the game, with Adiel Mannion shooting over the bar in the 17th minute, and Guiseppe Delgaudio having a shot from close range saved two minutes later. A save from Fallon prevented Lewis Sinclair adding a second goal for Baldock from a corner in the 26th minute, while both Jamie Ovington and Luke Peerless went close to pulling the scores level.

The equaliser came on the break from a Baldock corner in the 40th minute. Leverstock benefited from a good advantage played by the referee as Ovington was fouled, but Mannion took the ball forward and played a great pass to put Delgaudio clean through the middle. The Baldock defenders were looking for an offside flag which never came, and Delgaudio showed great composure to draw the keeper before slotting home the goal which sent the teams into the break on level terms.

Having escaped a half in which they did not play anything like their best with no damage, the Leverstock side proceeded to take the game by the scruff of the neck in the second half, playing neat, controlled passing football. After dominating the opening ten minutes of the half, Leverstock took a deserved lead in the 56th minute. A crossfield ball from Kian Wilkes found Brima Johnson, who played the ball inside for Mannion, who unleashed a great strike from the edge of the box that gave the keeper no chance as it flew into the net.

Two minutes later a pass from John Smith put Delgaudio through for what looked set to be a third goal until he was clearly brought down by a tackle from a defender, yet the referee waved away claims for a penalty to the amazement of the Leverstock contingent in the ground.

In the 77th minute there was another questionable decision when Smith was the victim of a challenge from Ben Burton that looked worthy of a red card, but Burton was only shown a yellow card. Smith's effort from the resulting free kick went just wide of the post. Two minutes later Mannion burst through on goal but his shot was saved by the keeper, and in the 80th minute Ovington's header from a corner shaved the outside of the post.

Despite Leverstock's dominance in the second half, with only a single goal lead the game was still in the balance, so there was some relief when the third goal finally arrived six minutes from time. A pass from Smith put Mannion through on goal, and although the keeper did well to parry his shot, defender Luke Rowland was running back and could not avoid the rebound cannoning off him into the net for an unfortunate own goal
