Officials and Supporters of Wembley Football Club.. We also welcome tonight's Officials the Referee Mark Bright and his assistants Trevor Gregory and Toby Carlisle. The last game at Pancake Lane against Biggleswade United saw neither side manage to get a goal so ended with both teams sharing a point. The same evening the Under 18 were defeated at Harpenden Town by three goals to nil. On Saturday the first team travelled to Leighton Town where the hosts scored just before the break and with no further goals we left empty handed. This week has seen the weather intervene as the first team fell foul when their game against Arlesey Town and then the Under 18 team with their local derby against Hemel Hempstead Town were postponed plus Saturday's game against London Colney also went with the weather. Next Wednesday the Under 18 go down the road to Kings Langley this game has been brought forward to get over Thursday's lockdown. WHERE NEXT !

WEMBLEY FOOTBALL CLUB was formed in 1946 following an amalgamation of various junior clubs, predominantly Sudbury Ratepayers Association and Sudbury Rangers. Nicknamed the 'Lions', (the symbol of the British Empire Exhibition held at Wembley in 1924/25, the emblem was also used by the local speedway and ice-hockey teams), they found a home at Vale Farm and have remained there ever since, developing a roped-off pitch into a respectable non-League football ground.

Entry was immediately made into the Middlesex League. After finishing a creditable fourth in their first season they went on to win the championship in 1947/48. A further season was spent in this league before the Club progressed into the Spartan League in 1949/50. Here they stayed for two years, clinching the Western Division title in 1950/51 as a result of which they became founder members of the Delphian League.

In season 1955/56 they reached the finals of both the London Senior Cup and Middlesex Senior Cup and also finished runners-up in the Delphian League. In recognition of these achievements they were invited to join the Corinthian League and subsequently vastly improved the facilities at Vale Farm.

Following a quiet period the Club moved into the Athenian League (1963/64) which had absorbed both the Corinthian and Delphian Leagues to create three divisions. Wembley were placed in the middle section. Malcolm Allison (1962-1963) and Allen Batsford (1964 -1965) were both employed as coaches by the Lions during this period, although their respective spells were brief. Both gentlemen went on to have distinguished careers elsewhere and who knows where the Club might be today had either one of them remained at Vale Farm.

Wembley did manage to gain promotion to the Premier Division in 1967/68. To anticipate further progress floodlights were installed, a new clubhouse and dressing-room complex were built and eventually admission to the expanding Isthmian League was granted in 1975. Finished runners-up in their final season justified Wembley's elevation.

Wembley began their first season in the Isthmian League (1975/76) in the second division (now the first division). The closest they came to promotion to the Premier Division was in 1985/86. After completing their fixtures, Wembley headed the table only to miss out on going up by two points when both St.Albans City and Bromley won their respective games in hand. Only two teams went up in those days.

Despite failing to achieve promotion, Wembley obtained some minor compensation by recording various cup successes during this period. In 1980/81 they reached the First Round Proper of the F.A. Cup for the one and only time, losing 0-3 to Enfield at Southbury Road.

The Middlesex Charity Cup was won outright for the first time in 1982/83, while the Middlesex Senior Cup was also clinched for the first time a season later with a dramatic 5-1 success over Hendon. In 1986/87 Wembley won the coveted Middlesex Cup double with final wins over Hayes in the Senior Cup and Feltham in the Charity Cup, a feat nearly repeated during the following season.

Both finals were lost although the disappointment was tempered by beating Brentford at Griffin Park in the semi-final of the Middlesex Charity Cup, and having the final played at Wembley Stadium.

Several unprofitable years have followed and a fire at Vale Farm during the summer of 1992 almost ended Wembley's existence. Fortunately, thanks to some splendid off-the-field work, new facilities were quickly erected and the Club survived.

Wembley last won some silverware in 1994/95 with a 2-0 victory over Hampton in the final of the Middlesex Charity Cup. The Lions also went on to reach the second round proper of the F.A. Trophy in 1995/96 (their best run in the old F.A. Amateur Cup was also ended at the second round proper stage 1966/67 and 1968/69). However, their lengthy first division status was ended at the finish of that season when they suffered relegation into division two (now in Step Five).

By claiming third place, a quick return to the first division was achieved a season later, but their division one tenure lasted just two seasons and they relegated again at the end of 1998/99. As a result of the restructuring of the Isthmian League's constitution, Wembley regained a berth in the first division (north) for the 2002/03 season. But they were unable to maintain their place and were demoted into the second division at the end of that campaign.

Wembley were forced to leave the Isthmian League set-up at the end of the 2005/06 season following the disbanding of the second division. They joined the Combined Counties League. A sterling effort was made to win promotion during their first season (2006/07), but ran out of steam to end the term in the third place.

Apart from that, they failed to make a real impact, although they did reach the final of the Combined Counties League Cup in 2010/11, but lost to Sandhurst Town, 0-1, at Farnborough. However, after their participation in the following season's F.A. Cup, (their Extra-Preliminary Round tie with Ascot United covered live on Facebook) competition sponsors Budweiser, offered the Lions a much-publicised deal which they could not refuse. This included the signing of several retired professionals to help the Lions progress as far as possible in the 2012/13 F.A. Cup under the guidance of Terry Venables. Unfortunately, Wembley only played three games in the competition before bowing out.

After eight years, Wembley's membership of the Combined Counties League was ended by a lateral move across Step Five of the non-League pyramid, and they commence their seventh season in the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division, after joining in 2014/15. Their highest placing finishing fourth in 2016/17.

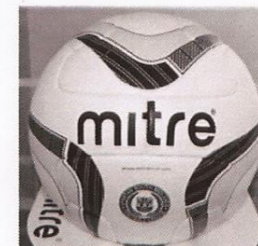

Leverstock Green put up a very good display against one of the title favourites in Leighton Town, but a single first half goal was enough for Leighton to take all three points.

As in the midweek game against Biggleswade, Leverstock came under pressure in the opening few minutes but withstood it. In the 4th minute Matt Fallon tipped over a cross from the right that had been caught by the wind, and shots from Ben Pattie and Ashton Campbell both went wide of the Green goal in the opening ten minutes.

Leverstock's first near miss came in the 13th minute when Jamie Calvin got up at the near post to meet a long throw from Brima Johnson, but flicked it just over the bar. In the 28th minute a corner from Frank Jowle was missed by home keeper Brad Kirkwood, but nobody could force the ball home. A minute later at the other end Ashton Campbell went close for Leighton with a lob from the edge of the area that just cleared the bar.

In the 32nd minute Calvin and Jowle combined on a quick break to put Oran Swales through on goal, but Kirkwood made a great low one-handed save to keep out Swales' shot. Two minutes later Swales tested Kirkwood with another shot, striking from the edge of the box after another Johnson long throw had been headed away.

Six minutes before half time the Leverstock resistance was broken down as Leighton launched a quick counter-attack. Campbell got in behind Johnson and ran on to slot the ball past Fallon and across goal to where Archie McClelland was coming in to finish with a tap-in. Leverstock also suffered a blow in that Swales had to leave the game through an injury picked up in the previous Green attack.

The second half followed a similar pattern with Leighton having more of the ball and most of the chances. Pattie and Jordon Frederick both put shots over the bar for Leighton just before the hour mark. On 65 minutes Leverstock went close when a neat backheel from Luke Peerless set up Calvin for a shot that went just over, and on 74 minutes a pass from John Smith sent Calvin away to hit a shot that was turned round the post by Kirkwood. Two minutes later Fallon stopped an effort from Connor Calcutt on the line and Mickey Shuttlewood completed the clearance. With five minutes left Fallon made another great save to keep out a shot from Sonny Newbury-Barr.

Leighton had other late chances, but wayward shooting meant that they still only had their single-goal lead going into the closing minutes. Leverstock almost made them pay in the 89th minute when a cross from Johnson was headed just wide by Calvin, and they won a couple of corners in stoppage time as the game remained in the balance to the end, but ultimately Leighton held out for the win.

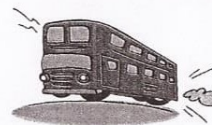

Leverstock Green and Biggleswade United fought out a tough, uncompromising 0-0 draw in Tuesday night's SSML Premier Division game. Despite the absence of goals it was an enthralling match with near misses at both ends. Both sides gave their all, and Leverstock in particular gave a resolute display at the back and were in no mood to give anything away.

There was another new signing making his debut tonight in centre forward Jamie Calvin, whose previous clubs include Daventry Town, Kings Langley, Kidlington and Hertford Town.

The visitors made a very fast start to the game and could have been a couple of goals up inside five minutes. In the second minute former Green player Ethan Flanagan got on the end of a cross from Codi Spavins and headed just wide. A minute later Charlie Black struck a shot from distance which Matt Fallon got a hand to and tipped onto the bar. At the other end Oran Swales put in a cross in the 5th minute that was cleared from the six yard box, and another which whipped across the face of goal in the 14th minute, but the first real chance came in the 18th minute when Dan Weeks got on the end of a cross but headed over the bar.

Biggleswade were threatening again on 22 minutes when a pass from Dave Parkinson put Spavins through, but after a couple of twists and turns Spavins' eventual shot was blocked by a sliding challenge from Mickey Shuttlewood. Two minutes later the action was at the other end when Swales hit a shot from a narrow angle which was saved by keeper Taylor Haddow. On 32 minutes Fallon made another great save, diving to his left to keep out a rasping shot from former Green player Parkinson with one hand. Three minutes later a deflected free kick from Swales caused some confusion in the Biggleswade six-yard box but the ball would not go in.

The game threatened to boil over in the closing minutes of the half, and Leverstock were temporarily reduced to ten men when John Smith was sent to the sin bin.

Five minutes into the second half the visitors hit the bar for a second time as Parkinson hit another fierce shot from distance, after which Smith rejoined the game. On 62 minutes Fallon had to save again, keeping the ball out with his legs when Spavins was through on goal. Two minutes later Weeks won the ball in midfield and ran on to hit a shot, but it was comfortably saved by Haddow. On 72 minutes a cross from Frank Jowle sailed just over the head of Calvin.

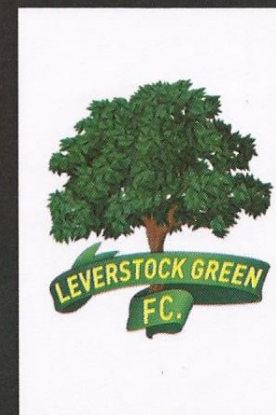
As the game went into stoppage time it was still 0-0, but Leverstock were very unlucky not to grab a late winner as they had all the pressure during stoppage time. Two minutes into stoppage time a free kick dropped for Calvin eight yards out, but his hooked shot went just over. Five minutes into stoppage time a corner from Swales was met at the far post by Shuttlewood with a downward header that bounced up and agonisingly just over the bar. The final whistle came soon after, and it was a deserved point for both sides, and an impressive result for Leverstock against a team that had won their last four games

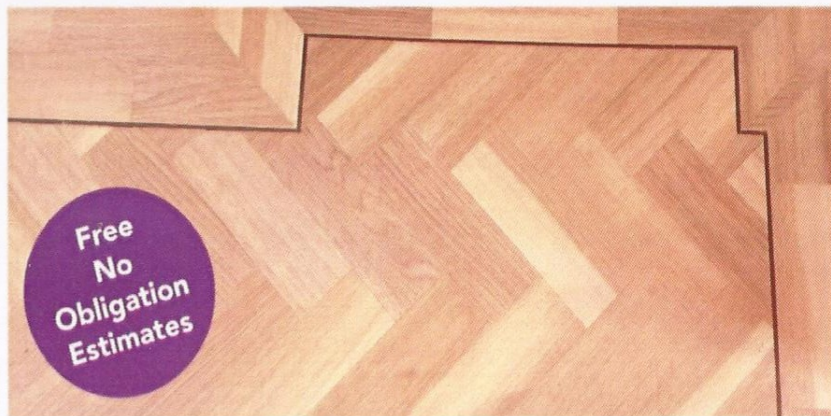
