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Visiting Club History:

Beaconsfield Town FC Club History

Though formed as recently as the summer of 2017 the roots of Beaconsfield Town FC stem from Beaconsfield SYCOB which was founded in 1994 following a merger between Beaconsfield United and Slough Youth Centre Old Boys (hence the “SYCOB” in the Clubs name).

United dated back to 1921 and were themselves a coming together of two local teams whilst Slough Youth Centre formed their first football team in 1938. With Slough Youth Centre Old Boys unable to progress due to a lack of ground provisions and United themselves struggling on and off the field at the time the decision was taken to amalgamate the two clubs and so Beaconsfield SYCOB was born.

Initially playing in the London Spartan Premier Division, and with Fred Deanus as Chairman, Beaconsfield SYCOB chalked up a series of Top Five finishes before finally winning the league in 2000 / 01 under the guidance of Simon Delahunty. However they were refused promotion to the Isthmian

League due to some harsh technicalities over the terms of their lease. A further three seasons were spent in the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division before Beaconsfield SYCOB again won the league in 2003 / 04 and this time gained promotion to the Southern Football League (Division One East).

The Rams made solid progress in their early years at Step 4 and over three seasons played in three different leagues – Division 1 East, Division 1 West and finally Division 1 South & West from where they were relegated in 2006 / 07. However the appointment of ex-player Jamie Jarvis, ably assisted by Peter Scott, saw The Rams not only win the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division at the first attempt but also win the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the Premier Division League Cup, a fantastic treble of silverware.

Promoted to Division 1 South & West, the club finished a highly creditable fourth place and made the Play Offs before losing out to AFC Totton. Moving to the Southern League Midland Division for 2009 / 10, Beaconsfield SYCOB then went through a succession of managers, players, highs and lows until finishing in bottom place in 2010 / 11. Only a reprieve and a league restructure saved The Rams from the drop but since then they have gone on to over achieve for a club of its size. Under the guidance of Byron Walton they

finished fifth in the 2011-12 season and lost out in the Play Off Final to Bedworth United.

The following season and with James Pritchard at the helm they again finished fifth but lost out to Rugby Town in a Play Off Semi-Final though the season did end with some silverware following a fine win over Chesham United in the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Cup.

2013-14 saw Gary Meakin take over as manager just five days before the start of the season and with only five players on the clubs books – to finish 8th and reach the Quarter Finals of the League Cup was a fine achievement as was a runner up spot in the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Cup, Chesham United gaining revenge for defeat twelve months earlier.

The 2014-15 season saw a partnership with the FAB Academy who provided the bulk of the teams players under the stewardship of Andy Hurley and Nas Bashir. That partnership continued into 2015-16 season with Geoff Warner as manager as The Rams finished in a respectable ninth place whilst the 2016-17 season saw them under joint managers Andy Hurley and Leigh Wooldridge and ended with a 16th place league finish though a run to the Fourth Qualifying Round of the F.A. Cup was a “Best Ever” for SYCOB.

The 2017-18 season saw the return of Gary Meakin as the first manager of the newly named Beaconsfield Town, with Chris Coyle as Chairman. The Rams had virtually a whole new team and, helped by an amazing away record, they kept in touch with the League pacesetters to finally gain top spot on the last day of the season and claim the Evo-Stik League South, East title. Competing at Level 3 for the first time in their history in the newly formed Evo-Stik League South Premier South division, The Rams achieved a highly credible 12th place finish as well as reaching the First Round of the F.A. Trophy for the first time in their history, losing out to eventual finalists Leyton Orient.

The truncated 2019/20 season saw the club expanding with the establishing of an Academy as well as an Under 18 team and plans in place to add further age group sides as The Rams look to build for the future both on and off the pitch.

Match Reports

Leverstock Green 3 vs 3 Aylesbury United

Leverstock Green came back from 3-1 down against Aylesbury United and should have gone on to win the game against ten men, but had to settle for yet another draw as they were unable to put the ball in the net during a frantic final ten minutes.

There were two further additions to the Leverstock squad today, with 17 year old striker Jael Norville joining on a work experience loan from Watford, and experienced utility player Lewis Rolfe signing on a dual registration from Chesham United.

Leverstock should have been ahead within twenty seconds of the kick off. After good build-up play from Jeffrey Sekyere and Iker Noguera Leon, Rolfe delivered a cross which Radu-Mihai Stefanovaica came in to meet, but put it wide from point blank range. However, in the 5th minute Leverstock were awarded a penalty for a mistimed tackle that brought down Stefanovaica, and Sekyere made no mistake from the spot kick to put them into a 1-0 lead.

Leverstock looked good value for their lead, but it was short-lived as the visitors equalised in the 15th minute through Sonny French, who hit a dipping shot from outside the box which flew over Harry Way. Worse was to come, as an almost identical strike from Finlay Reeves put Aylesbury 2-1 up in the 26th minute from only their second shot of the game. Leverstock were denied an equaliser in the 33rd minute, with Ducks keeper Jack Hopwood pulling off a great save to keep out Leon's shot after a cross from Stefanovaica had set him up.

The visitors took their lead into the break, and extended it in the 51st minute when Luke Martin bundled the ball home from a poorly-defended corner. However, Leverstock got themselves back into the game within two minutes, as Dan Pett exchanged passes with Sekyere before slotting past Hopwood to reduce the arrears to 3-2.

Leverstock pressed for an equaliser, with Stefanoaica going on a solo run into the box before having his shot turned wide by Hopwood on 62 minutes, and two minutes later heading over the bar from a Rolfe cross. The visitors were then reduced to ten men. Reeves had been yellow-carded for a blatant dive in the box on 58 minutes, and six minutes later received a second yellow for delaying a restart.

The game was played almost entirely in the Aylesbury half from this point. Norville came off the bench for his debut in the 69th minute, and a minute later another chance was missed as Sekyere headed wide from a Stefanoaica cross. Finally in the 80th minute Leverstock got the equaliser their pressure deserved. Pett's pass set up a chance for Norville, and the youngster produced a neat finish from a narrow angle to make the score 3-3.

Over the remaining minutes there was a series of corners, crosses and goalmouth scrambles, but the ball would not go in the net for Leverstock. Sekyere and Stefanoaica both missed clear chances from close range and the Aylesbury defence also produced a couple of goal-line clearances. Assistant manager Scott McGleish brought himself off the bench to make an extra target for a last-gasp free kick, but again the ball would not go in.

Barton Rovers 4 vs 1 Leverstock Green

Match Report

Leverstock Green's winless run goes on after they were well-beaten by high-flying Barton Rovers in Tuesday night's Southern League fixture. Leverstock were unlucky to be behind after a largely even first half, but a lacklustre second half display saw the home side take control of the game.

After a quiet opening to the game, Josh Dooley had to clear a cross off the line in the 18th minute, and two minutes later Harry Way made a save at his near post. At the other end Jeffrey Sekyere had a shot parried away by home keeper Ben Heath in the 28th minute, and a minute later Marcus Warren curled a shot just over the bar.

Leverstock's frailty from corners was in evidence again in the 39th minute as Albie Hall rose highest at the near post to head Barton into a 1-0 lead. Leverstock should have equalised just before the break when a good chance fell to Warren, but he hit it straight at the keeper.

Four minutes into the second half Leverstock made the fatal mistake of giving the ball away on the halfway line, and were instantly punished as a pass down the left side put Hall through to drill home a shot from a narrow angle to double Barton's lead.

Leverstock might have pulled a goal back in the 58th minute as Warren pulled the ball back from the bye-line to Sekyere, but a momentary delay on the shot allowed a defender to get a boot in and deflect it over the bar. Instead they went 3-0 down two minutes later when a contentious free kick was floated into the

box and former Leverstock player Rawn Seale was free to shoot home.

There was a consolation goal for Leverstock in the 90th minute as Tom Georgiou struck an excellent shot from the edge of the box into the corner of the net. However, while pushing for another goal they were caught on the break in the 3rd minute of stoppage time and Marcus Gouldbourne scored a fourth goal for Barton.

Marlow 2 vs 2 Leverstock Green

Match Report

It was another frustrating night for Leverstock Green, as they once again only came away with a point from a game where they should have collected all three. Leverstock missed a number of clear-cut chances that could have put the game away by half time on a wet night at Marlow.

However, home side Marlow could also have been three goals up within the opening five minutes. With just over a minute played a shot from Mitch Parker hit the bar, A minute later a shot from Calvin Gitiba was deflected across goal and wide, and in the 5th minute Naheer Nawaf went on a mazy run into the box and had only Harry Way to beat, but pulled his shot wide. Two minutes later Marlow had a free kick just outside the penalty area, but Parker's shot went over the bar. Marlow did eventually take the lead in the 12th minute as the ball was pulled back from the byeline to find Parker with a low shot into the net from close range.

Leverstock eventually settled down, and had a very good spell from midway through the first half. In the 24th minute Joe McCarthy was through on goal, but at the moment he got his shot away, a defender's boot came in to deflect it wide. From the resulting corner, Dan Pett's cross was headed away, but only back to Pett, who at the second attempt delivered the perfect cross to the far post for Callum Neal to head home the equaliser.

Leverstock should have been in front in the 28th minute. A pass from Ryan Carruthers set McCarthy free down the left, and his cross found Radu-Mihai Stefanoaica right in front of goal, but his shot was straight at keeper James Sharlott. Stefanoaica made amends four minutes later, though, as a pass from Nat Connolly freed him down the right. As Stefanoaica was heading for goal, he could have shot himself but instead squared for Jeffrey Sekyere, who was coming in unmarked and hit a first time shot home to put Leverstock into a 2-1 lead.

There should have been another one two minutes later as Stefanoaica and Pett combined to set up Sekyere for an almost identical chance, but this time he shot wide of the target. Five minutes before the break Way pulled off a good save to turn away a shot from Nawaf ensuring that Leverstock took their lead into half time.

Another good chance was missed just over a minute into the second half as Stefanoaica was through on goal again and looked set to score, but his shot was

saved by Charlott and Sekyere couldn't get the rebound under control. In the 50th minute Pett hit a free kick just over the bar, and Leverstock had to make a change at the back as the injured Tommy Boxer had to leave the game. He was replaced by George Mitchell-Gears, playing the first game of his second spell at the club after a move from Daventry Town this week. Marlow took advantage of the reorganised backline, as Nawaf shot home an equaliser to make it 2-2 in the 54th minute.

Leverstock continued to push forward, with McCarthy being flagged offside a number of times, some of which looked like harsh decisions. In the 63rd minute McCarthy got on the end of a cross from Neal with a shot that was saved by Charlott.

Both sides could have won the game from corners in stoppage time. Firstly Jael Norville headed wide at the far post from a Leverstock corner, and then Marlow won a corner in the final minute which caused a goalmouth scramble as the ball was not cleared, but two shots from close range were somehow blocked by Leverstock defenders. In the end it was a 10th draw from 19 league games for Leverstock.

SERIAL winner David Nugent enjoyed after a long and distinguished professional career at the likes of Bury, Preston North End, Portsmouth, Burnley, Leicester City, Middlesbrough, Derby County and Tranmere Rovers.

The striker lifted the FA Cup with Portsmouth in 2008 and won the Championship with Leicester in 2013-14. He also represented England, scoring in his solitary Three Lions appearance in a 3-0 win over Andorra.

But after more than four years "happily retired" and focused on being a dad, Nugent is back in football with Anstey Nomads after accepting an invite to dovetail his work towards a UEFA B licence with player-coach duties at Cropston Road.

And, thus far, it has been the perfect partnership so far. Not only is player-coach Nugent enjoying a new lease of life, but the Step 4 Nomads have picked up 25 points from a possible 30 in NPL Midlands since his arrival.

They include the scalps of higher-ranked Stratford Town and Bedford Town in a club-record FA Trophy run that has teed up this afternoon's third round trip to National League Hartlepool United.

"[The buzz] is coming back," Nugent told The NLP last week.

“When I retired I just wanted to stay away from football as much as possible. I wasn’t playing how I wanted to and it ended quite badly really.

“I was a striker, I wanted to score goals and run in on the back of defenders and I couldn’t do it anymore. I would break down with little niggly injuries, I was 36 and started to wonder whether I needed it.

“Towards the end I went on loan at Tranmere in League Two and didn’t really play – that was time up for me.

“Like anyone, I wanted it to end happily but it didn’t turn out that way so I left football behind thinking I would never get back into it but Conrad (Logan, Anstey manager) and all the lads here have been different class.

“We play football, we don’t just lump it forward, and that is credit to Conrad and players, so the love for the game is starting to come back and I am enjoying watching rather than playing.”

Nugent’s Nomads are among a number of lower-ranked clubs looking to cause a major Trophy upset in a fascinating array of ties this afternoon.

Step 4 Clitheroe host star-studded York City, while Southern League Premier Central high-flyers Harborough Town, no strangers to producing the odd cup shock over the last couple of seasons, welcome Mark Hughes’ Carlisle United to Bowden Park.

Hanwell Town manager Chris Moore heads back to his former club Dagenham & Redbridge, while Step 4 pair Leatherhead and Harrow Borough will be sensing a golden opportunity as they lock horns at Fetcham Grove for a place in the last 32.

National League leaders Rochdale go to Step 2 strugglers Leamington, while holders Aldershot Town make the short trip down the M3 to top-flight rivals Eastleigh.

And the trio flying the flag for Non-League are all in action also; Macclesfield go to National League North rivals South Shields, Boreham Wood host Brackley Town and Weston-super-Mare face a tough trip to take on Robbie Savage's Forest Green Rovers.

In the Isuzu FA Vase, holders Whitstable Town are safely through to the fourth round on January 17 after a 3-0 win over Eastbourne United last Saturday.

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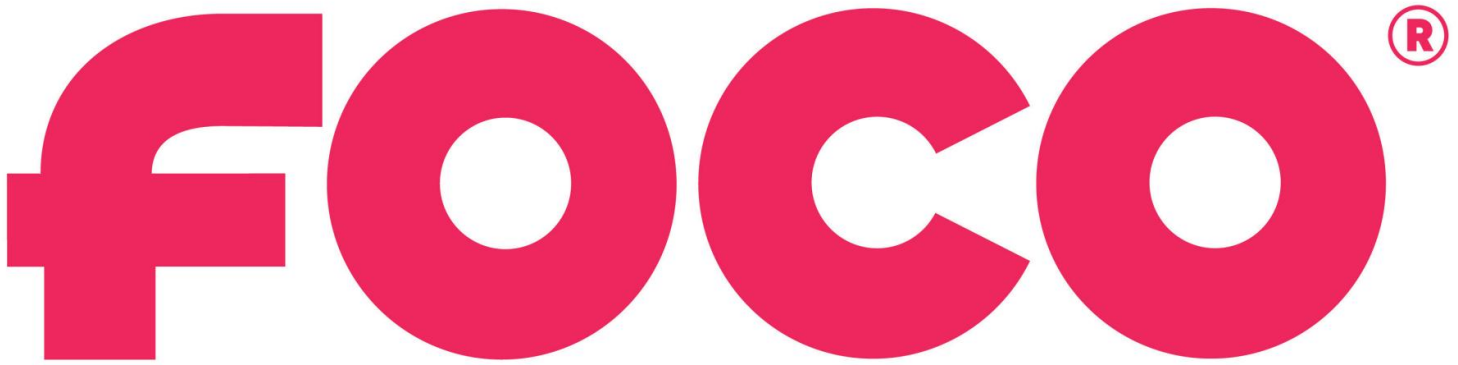

LEVERSTOCK GREEN | LEVELS RISING

It's been a successful journey for Nat Connolly



The story of Nat Connolly's rise through the levels to go on to make 100 appearances for Leverstock Green is inspiring.

The all-action midfield general had racked up over a century of appearances for Totternhoe at Step 7 by the age of 21 to earn his chance with Green in the summer of 2023.

His determined displays in the engine room of the side helped the club secure promotion into the Southern League where Connolly has thrived over the past 14 months.

"I remember joining the club and worrying that the jump in level would be too much for me," he admitted to us. "I'd previously

played all of my football at Step 7, so I didn't know if I would be able to get to grips with Step 5.

"I joined the club not knowing anyone and feeling that I had a lot to prove, but I was made to feel welcome by everyone straight away and that really helped me to hit the ground running.

"With the help and support of those around me, I knuckled down, worked hard and that first season was really memorable as we secured promotion into the Southern League.

"Then the question is can I do it at Step 4? Last season we managed to achieve our objective of staying at this level and I was pleased with the way in which I adapted to the added demands of this level.

"To have reached 100 appearances in just under two and-a-half seasons means a lot. I am proud to have established myself in the team and I'm really enjoying my football amongst some great people."

Saturday's 100th game saw Connolly put in an energetic display in a 1-1 draw at Northwood.

"I felt that I played well," he added. "I try and base my game on energy and I made sure that I kept the levels high. I tried to get forward a bit more and almost nicked a goal at one point.

"We weren't happy with our first half performance, but we managed to get a grip of things after the break and deservedly equalised. Sadly, it was too little too late in terms of being able to find a winner and we had to be content with a point in the end.

"We know that we need to start turning some of our draws into wins in order to start climbing the table.

“There have already been a few surprise results this season throughout the division; it’s clear that everyone is capable of beating each other and it’s going to be very competitive once more.

“First and foremost our main aim is to survive, but I believe that we can achieve more and there is no reason why we can't improve upon last season’s finishing position. We’ve got a season’s experience under our belt now and we know that we have to pick up as many points as we can early on to give us a base to build on for the second half of the season.

“We seem to perform well against the better teams, but it’s the games against those teams around us where we need to start picking up more points.

“In terms of personal targets, I just want to keep enjoying my football and continue to play regularly.”

A home game against high-flying Ware is next up for Connolly and his team-mates at the weekend.
