





Visiting Club History:

Marlow Club History:

It was on November 22nd 1870 at the Compleat Angler Hotel on the banks of the Thames that Great Marlow Football Club was formed and so began the history of one of the oldest clubs in the country. In the Club's early years it was a major force in the game and as one of the original entrants in the first FA Cup competition in 1871/72 contributed a share of the £25 that bought the first trophy. In the very first year of the competition a certain Cuthbert Ottaway turned out for Marlow and just a year later he was to captain the national side against Scotland in the first ever officially recognised international match.

Marlow have the unique distinction of being the only club to have applied for entry to every competition since its inception although they were unable to compete once in the 1910/11 season. In 1882 they reached the semi-finals where they lost out to eventual winners Old Etonians 0-5 at the Oval. Two Amateur Cup semi-finals and a host of Berks & Bucks Senior Cup wins were among many honours won in this golden age. In 1894 Marlow rejected the opportunity to join the newly-formed Southern League in order to retain their amateur status and allowed Tottenham Hotspur to begin their climb to the top flight by taking their place.

The Club's ground until 1919 was Crown Meadow, now the Riley Recreational Ground. An enforced move to the Star Meadow (which was unfenced) and the worsening financial situation resulted in the need to play in a more local competition than the Great Western Suburban League and Marlow joined the Reading and District League. This was a dark period for the Club and worse was to come when the Club's long-serving Honorary Secretary Alfred Davis, who had held office at the Club since 1891, died in 1924. It was decided that a fitting memorial to him would be to provide a permanent home for Marlow F.C. An appeal proved to be very successful and the "Alfred Davis Memorial Ground" saw its first game in 1928. The picturesque grandstand dates from 1930's and followed the establishment of an Association who issued Share Certificates in connection with a Building Fund and was built to celebrate the Club's revival and the Spartan League Division Two championship.

Apart from a war-time break Marlow continued in the Spartan League until 1965 when entry was gained to the Athenian League Division Two. Promotion to Division One was secured in season 1970/71. Here Marlow remained until 1984 when they joined the Isthmian League. Having finished bottom of Division Two in 1985 the appointment of Mike Keen as Manager heralded a rapid rise in status. Promotion to Division One came the very next season and then after just one season in Division One the championship was won after a two horse race with Grays Athletic and along with it promotion to the Premier Division.

Here Marlow found things much tougher and Christmas arrived without a win and from a position at the foot of the table relegation looking very likely. However a late season Houdini act saw them escape and secure their new-found status. When Keen left his assistant Dave Russell took over and brought in Laurie Craker as Coach. Under them good times returned and the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was won for the first time that century with a victory over local rivals Wycombe Wanderers and the F.A Cup First Round was reached, also for the first time that century, with an away tie at West Bromwich Albion the reward. Season 1992/93 saw even more F.A Cup success with progression this time to the Third Round and a tie with Tottenham Hotspur that was switched to White Hart Lane where almost 27000 saw the Blues give a very creditable performance. The Diadora (Isthmian) League Cup was won to finish the season on a high note by beating Molesey.

1993/94 must rate as the most successful ever with Marlow again reaching the First Round of the F.A Cup where a 0-2 home defeat against Plymouth Argyle was featured on T.V, while in the league a highest-ever position of third was achieved. The Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was won again with a 1-0 win over local rivals Chesham Utd. to round off a highly memorable season.

At the end of that season Russell and Craker left for Slough Town and took several players with them. A new squad and slow start left a lot to do in the league and a brave late fight failed to see the Blues avoid relegation. In the F.A Cup things were very different. The First Round saw Division Two table-toppers Oxford Utd. defeated 2-0 at Oak Tree Road and the Blues became the first winners of the Littlewoods Pools' Giant Killers award. Another home victory followed over Trophy holder's Woking to secure a place in the Third Round Proper once again and a trip to Swindon Town, who had been in the Premier League the season before, where the home side were grateful to progress by a 2-0 scoreline.

Season 1995/96 saw a great finish in the league in eighth spot but the following one got off to a terrible start from which the Club was never able to recover – and despite victories over virtually all the top sides, relegation was confirmed on the last day of the season. Russell returned for the following season and with him high hopes but the season proved to be one of under-achievement and a new team of Graham Pritchard and Derek Sweetman took over for 1998/99 and provided a period of stability which saw finishes in mid-table. Following the departure of Pritchard just before season 2001/02 Sweetman took over the reins and his first game in charge saw the capture of the Associate Members Trophy in a final held over from the previous season. The side finished the season in 9th position in the league – the highest for some time – before restructuring saw them move from Division Two to the newly-formed Division One North for season 2002/03 where an 11th place finish was achieved. In the F.A Trophy they progressed to the Third Round before going out at Dagenham & Redbridge.

Marlow again found themselves in new surroundings the following season having transferred to Division One South and although inconsistent form saw them finish 16th in the league they again had an excellent run in the F.A Trophy which took them to the Fourth Round for the first time in their history. Several notable victories saw them through before a strong Tamworth outfit ended their run at Oak Tree Road.

The reorganization of the non-league game saw them in different surroundings for the fourth time in four seasons with entry into The Southern League where they competed in the Western Division for season 2004/05 and finished in 13th spot. Kevin Stone had moved into the manager's seat towards the end of the season and enjoyed a great run. 2005/06 and in the same league and in more familiar surroundings seemed to suit the side and for most of the season they hovered around the play-off positions and eventually finished in 6th spot. A play-off spot was confirmed on the final day of the season and although a 1-2 defeat at Brackley Town followed the Club were pleased with the progress. Season 2006/07 in the South & West Division saw a successful run of results promise another play-off berth but a last day defeat at Winchester City saw them fall just short whilst season 2007/08 was a little more disappointing with some very good results failing to offset a poor run around February/March with a final finish just outside the play-offs resulting.

Season 2008/09 saw the Club moved yet again into the Midland Division and another inconsistent season followed finishing with a defeat to Windsor & Eton in the final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup at M.K Dons stadium.

The following two seasons saw some good results against the top sides but indifferent ones against the lower teams and ended with mid-table finishes even though a bright start in 2010/11 saw them briefly at the top of the table. 2011/12 did not start at all badly but soon developed into one where victories were very hard to come by and following a string of poor results long-standing manager Stone left just after Christmas. Assistant Steve Croxford took over and although performances and results improved towards the end it was not enough to avoid relegation.

Season 2012/13 found Marlow in new surroundings in the UHlsport Hellenic League with a new management team, headed by Mark Bartley, eager to recapture some of the glories of the past. This they did, winning the league championship by a 16 point margin and scoring 123 goals in 36 games to regain their previous status in the Southern League where 2013/14 season saw them consolidate their newly-regained status followed with finishes in 17th and 11th positions respectively.

For 2015/16 Marlow found themselves moved once again – to the South & West division – which again meant increased travelling and associated costs, the loss of some key players and being deprived of several local derbies making life much more difficult than it really needed to be. In the circumstances a mid-table finish was achieved and a return to the Central Division for this season looks to be more appealing.

A return to the Central Division for 2016/17 aided a finish in 4th place (on goal difference) and achieved a play-off place, with third-placed Barton Rovers running out 2-0 victors at their ground.

Season 2017/18 ended with a mid-table finish followed by a return to the Isthmian League after a lengthy absence to take a place in the newly-formed South-Central division with a resultant reduction in travelling which is most welcome.

Season 2018/19 was a successful one and generally good results saw Marlow FC maintain a position near the top of the table throughout the season and qualify for the play-offs where they lost out 1-2 in a closely fought semi-final to eventual winners Cheshunt at their ground.

Season 2019/20 saw MFC remain in the South Central division and as expected after a successful previous season, a few players left, some to join other higher placed teams. After a reasonable start results deteriorated due principally through a serious spate of injuries to key players which took some time to recover from. Eventually things began to improve in 2020 but the Covid-19 virus pandemic caused a halt to all football games in March throughout the UK and ending the season. The 2020/21 started, but ended again after football was again halted before we had made it to Christmas.

With the worst of the pandemic looking to be behind us, the expectation was that season 2021/22 would be played to a finish. The first half of the season saw the team riding high in the table but once again, injuries to key players took their toll along with a severe drop in form, meant we finished in 7th place.

At the end of the season it was clear that change was needed. Several players moved to play at a higher level, others were released and a new squad was built for the 2022/23 season. Despite a slow start, the new squad developed well and finished a creditable third in the Isthmian South Central Division, but lost out to Hanworth Villa in the playoff semi-final. The team also made it to the County Cup final, losing out to Brackell Town.

A proposed lateral move to the Southern League Central Division for season 2023/24 was overturned on appeal, with the club returning to the Isthmian League. The team finished in a creditable second place and at the fourth time or asking achieved a playoff victory and secured promotion to Step 3 in the Southern League Premier South for 2024/25. For the second consecutive season the team also reached the county cup final losing out to Reading FC.

The move up to step 3 for the 2024/25 season proved a challenge too far as the club were relegated and drop into the Southern League Central division for the forthcoming season.

Visiting Club Pen Pics:

ALFIE AGAR – Debut 4/1/2025 A versatile young player who can operate at left-back, on the wing or in more advanced roles, Alfie has progressed through the Blues' under 18s into the senior squad. Direct and positive in possession, he's at his best in forward areas where he can drive at defenders. A very promising talent.

JAMAL BRNKER – Debut 4/10/2014 A seasoned wide man who came through at Southampton and adds invaluable experience to the side. Returning for his third spell with the Blues, he has also turned out for Thatcham Town, North Leigh and others.

GEORGE BROUGH – Debut 7/10/2025 Strong, technical and versatile left sided defender, either as a full back, wingback or as centre back or central midfielder. Currently with Canvey Island and dual registered with Marlow. Previously at Sandhurst Town collecting the most appearances in the squad

LOUIE CARR – Debut 14/10/2025 Lively young midfielder who recently signed for the Blues and brings a high work rate and influence in forward positions. Was previously with Hertford Town and had loan spells at Dunstable and Baldock Town.

SEB D'AVERSA – Debut 22/8/2023 Composed, left-footed defender who joined the Blues from Virginia Water. Calm and assured on the ball at the back, he combines defensive solidity with the ability to contribute going forward. A regular in the first-team since joining, he also brings experience from representative football, having been selected for England Colleges.

JACK EMPSON – Debut 25/10/2025 A powerful, mobile defender who started out at Kettering Town and has since featured for Aylesbury United and Northwood. Now with the Blues, he adds strength, energy and reliability at the heart of the back line. Joined from Biggleswade Town.

CALVIN GITIBA – Debut 9/8/2025 Midfielder who joined the Blues from Rusthall after first being spotted with Rising Ballers. Has a good eye for a pass and can unlock play with moments of quality. Adds a different creative option in the middle of the park.

FLAVIO GYAWU-KYEM – Debut 9/8/2025 Pacy, unpredictable winger who arrives at the Blues following time with Langley, St Panteleimon and FC Romania. With quick feet and a fearless approach, he brings flair and direct running to the Marlow attack.

LUQMAN KASSIM – Debut 9/8/2025 Pacy winger/forward who joined the Blues in July 2025 from Aylesbury United, after spells in Maidenhead's under-23s and a stint playing in Finland.

Known for his direct style and goal threat, he brings pace and attacking intent down the flanks.

ABDALLAH KHALIL – Debut 9/8/2025 Dynamic defender-midfielder who arrived at the Blues at the start of the 2025 season. He also featured for Beckenham Town and Badshot Lea, gaining valuable experience before joining Marlow on the recommendation of popular former Blue Mo Jallow. His versatility makes him a valuable option across both the back line and midfield.

HARVEY MAUDNER – Debut 21/9/2024 Lively young midfielder who joined the Blues from Reading Academy where he featured for their under 18s, 21s and 23s. Had a short spell with Southall before returning, although injury has hampered his progress so far.

SHAMAR MOORE – 9/8/2025 Energetic centre-forward who joined the Blues in July 2025 after spells with Thatcham Town – following earlier academy stints with Portsmouth and Reading, and time at Bracknell and Basingstoke. Always looking to make an impact in the final third, he's added goals and presence up front for Marlow this season. A forward with pace, finishing instinct and the versatility to press defenders and link play

NAHEER OMAR NAWAF – Debut 29/8/22 Quick winger who joined at the beginning of the 2023/24 season, quickly making an impact and scoring 12 goals for the Blues. Drew the attention of local rivals Bracknell Town starting the 2023/24 season with them, but quickly returned to the fold.

RYAN NORTH – 2/12/23 Young goalkeeper from Slough Town who first made an appearance for the blues back in 2023. Previously dual-registered with Holyport and Leverstock Green winning young player of the season awards at both clubs.

KWESI NTIM – Debut 9/8/2025 Young midfielder/winger who joined Marlow after a spell with Leatherhead. Progressed through the youth system at Kingstonian before breaking in to their first team. Also had a spell at Canvey Island.

CHRIS OVENDEN – Debut 10/11/2012 Right-sided defender or midfielder who was with Henley Town before joining and who has also played for Hartley Wintney. Consistent player who has scored some important goals. Season 2014-15 Manager's Player-Of-The-Year and 2015-16 Supporters Player of the Season.

MITCH PARKER – Debut 30/11/2024 Centre-forward who arrived at Marlow in November 2024 after a spell with Binfield. Offers intelligent movement and a proven instinct in front of goal, contributing important finishes in tight games. Brings experience and a composed presence at the top end of the pitch.

TOBY RAGGETT – Debut 1/8/22 Quick winger who joined for the 2022/23 season, netting 7 times in 29 appearances. Signed by Queen of the South for the 2023/24 season, but struggled with injuries, before returning to the Blue late in February 2024.

LAST week, The NLP reported on a proposed restructuring of the National League System which will ultimately ensure that clubs at Steps 5 and 6 will travel shorter distances to away games.

At a meeting last month, the FA formally presented to league officials its plan to add seven new divisions at Step 6 – increasing the current number from 17 to 24.

The aim would be for each to have 18 clubs.

“It won’t be a perfect fit, but it’s probably the best fit for now,” Chris Stirrup, North West Counties League chairman, told us. “This isn’t an easy task.”

A review by the FA, with the objective of reducing the geographical footprint of existing divisions at Step 6, has been ongoing for a while.

It hopes to conclude by the end of this season so changes to the relevant regulations for promotion and relegation can be made before the start of next term.

Implementation could then follow for the 2027-28 campaign.

“The status quo isn’t sustainable for clubs in certain areas of the country,” said James Earl, head of National League System (NLS) at the FA, during an interview with *The NLP* last August.

“There are some that are really struggling with the travel distances, and we try to balance that with fluctuating division sizes, but I just don’t think that’s a palatable long-term solution.

“However, you can’t make quick decisions to alter the pyramid because you must ensure you’ve gone through the unintended consequences, worked out what the best solution is, and how you put that into practice.”

Currently, National League System regulations permit a maximum of 340 clubs at Step 6.

An increase of 92 would be needed at that level to fill 24 divisions with 18 members each.

While there has been discussion about how that could be achieved, no decision has been made.

One possibility is for the FA to reduce the number of relegations from Step 6 in the run-up to implementation, while another suggestion is for the regulations permitting only one club to be considered for promotion from each regional feeder league to be amended.

However, the bad news for Step 7 clubs looking for a free pass into the NLS is that stadium accreditation criteria are unlikely to be relaxed for applicant clubs from those competitions.

It also isn't set in stone where the new divisions will be located, nor who might run them, but it is universally accepted there are some divisions in need of major surgery.

Take the Hellenic League Division One for example. Not long ago, this division was contested solely by clubs situated in the Thames Valley region of Berkshire and parts of Wiltshire alone.

w, however, it has branched out to the counties of Gloucestershire, Herefordshire, Worcestershire and surrounding areas, such as parts of Oxfordshire, Shropshire, Northamptonshire and Warwickshire.

It means clubs like Redditch Borough face a gruelling 156-mile trip to face Wantage Town, yet Cradley Town, 12 miles away, ply their trade in the Midland League.

“It won't be everybody's cup of tea but if it's most people's shot of whisky then that's a good thing,” said Stirrup, who succeeded Paul Lawler as NWCFL chairman last summer.

“As leagues, we have a responsibility to do what we can, the best we can. I've learned, even in my short time as chairman, that we can't be selfish on this issue and we mustn't lose sight of the bigger picture.

“My impression is that the FA really wants to get this right, and is open to ideas from those of us tasked with running leagues.”

Unfortunately, these proposed changes have come too late to save two Step 6 clubs from withdrawing from their respective divisions.

Last week, Truro City pulled their reserves from the South West Peninsula League after a “strategic partnership” with Helston Athletic failed to work out as planned.

Labelled “groundbreaking”, the joint venture saw the National League Tinnners’ second team play their games at Kellaway Park, home of Western League Helston, and offer a pathway to play for the Blues at Step 5.

It vowed to develop young footballers and help protect Truro’s pitch ahead of Step 1, but on Tuesday Truro informed the SWPL they were pulling out with immediate effect.

And at the same time, Allextion & New Parks pulled out of the Midland League Division One following a 15-0 hammering at Leicester St Andrews.

In their 30th season, the Leicester-based were bottom of the table with just six points and one win from 30 games, having conceded 128 goals and scoring just 24.

As Leicestershire Senior League champions, they had moved up to the Midland League at Step 6 in 2024.

Both will be sorely missed at the level with their demises presenting a timely reminder to FA and league chiefs that a reshuffle at Steps 5 and 6 is long overdue.



LEVERSTOCK GREEN | LEVELS RISING

It's been a successful journey for Nat Connolly



The story of Nat Connolly's rise through the levels to go on to make 100 appearances for Leverstock Green is inspiring.

The all-action midfield general had racked up over a century of appearances for Totternhoe at Step 7 by the age of 21 to earn his chance with Green in the summer of 2023.

His determined displays in the engine room of the side helped the club secure promotion into the Southern League where Connolly has thrived over the past 14 months.

"I remember joining the club and worrying that the jump in level would be too much for me," he admitted to us. "I'd previously

played all of my football at Step 7, so I didn't know if I would be able to get to grips with Step 5.

"I joined the club not knowing anyone and feeling that I had a lot to prove, but I was made to feel welcome by everyone straight away and that really helped me to hit the ground running.

"With the help and support of those around me, I knuckled down, worked hard and that first season was really memorable as we secured promotion into the Southern League.

"Then the question is can I do it at Step 4? Last season we managed to achieve our objective of staying at this level and I was pleased with the way in which I adapted to the added demands of this level.

"To have reached 100 appearances in just under two and-a-half seasons means a lot. I am proud to have established myself in the team and I'm really enjoying my football amongst some great people."

Saturday's 100th game saw Connolly put in an energetic display in a 1-1 draw at Northwood.

"I felt that I played well," he added. "I try and base my game on energy and I made sure that I kept the levels high. I tried to get forward a bit more and almost nicked a goal at one point.

"We weren't happy with our first half performance, but we managed to get a grip of things after the break and deservedly equalised. Sadly, it was too little too late in terms of being able to find a winner and we had to be content with a point in the end.

"We know that we need to start turning some of our draws into wins in order to start climbing the table.

“There have already been a few surprise results this season throughout the division; it’s clear that everyone is capable of beating each other and it’s going to be very competitive once more.

“First and foremost our main aim is to survive, but I believe that we can achieve more and there is no reason why we can't improve upon last season’s finishing position. We’ve got a season’s experience under our belt now and we know that we have to pick up as many points as we can early on to give us a base to build on for the second half of the season.

“We seem to perform well against the better teams, but it’s the games against those teams around us where we need to start picking up more points.

“In terms of personal targets, I just want to keep enjoying my football and continue to play regularly.”

A home game against high-flying Ware is next up for Connolly and his team-mates at the weekend.
